

Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students**Update as of April 10, 2022 for the Quarter Ended March 31, 2022****CRRSA HEERF II: SAIHE Absolute Priority 7**

1. New England Law|Boston has signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement in connection for funding Higher Education Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students (HEERF). The institution intends to use 100% of fund received under this grant, as required, to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. Under this grant, New England Law|Boston was awarded \$283,915 for emergency financial aid grants to students under program 84.425S. As of March 31, 2022, the school has received the \$145,000 of these funds.
2. As of March 31, 2022, the total dollar amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students is \$245,585. Approximately 848 students are eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education act of 1965. However, we understand that ALL students are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRSSA. In fall 2022, there were approximately 1,064 students enrolled.
3. As of this update, the total number of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students in this round of funding is 122.
4. The institution reviews each application carefully and thoughtfully, giving consideration to the requirements of this grant with the guidance available. First, students represent the nature of their financial emergency, and we give priority to those with extreme need. Second, we review the nature of the financial emergency and its connection to the coronavirus emergency and the related disruption caused by the move to remote instruction. Finally, we consider the total amount of funding available to the institution, and endeavor to spread that amount over as many eligible applicants as possible. The application process remains open until all funds are spent on student financial grants.
